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Education for democratic citizenship (EDC) in the Netherlands

- 1. EDC has proven to be effective, under certain circumstances, for social and political participation
- 2. A cross curricular approach of EDC is not sufficient. The quality of teachers is crucial for the effects of EDC. A separate and compulsory subject and specially trained teachers deliver better results for social and political participation
- National policymakers should be informed about the best way to optimize EDC effectiveness
 This can best be done by a campaign of NGOs active in this field
- 4. EDC can play an important role in integrating immigrants in society
- 5. The most important element of EDC is media literacy
- 6. Service learning should be an integral and standard part of EDC
- 7. A well functioning civil society is essential for democracy. Where necessary NGOs should, for its continuity, receive financial support from governments
